


Food Assistance

The Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women Infants and Children (WIC)

provides vouchers for nutritious food, health screenings, nutrition counseling, and breastfeeding promotion and support. Only pregnant women/new mothers, children under age 5 and infants qualify for WIC.



In FY2017:

WIC served 34,433 women, 36,541 infants, & 65,187 children.¹
Average monthly food cost was \$34.34 per person.

SNAP Eligibility

- All household members must have Social Security numbers.
- Felons who are in violation of probation or parole cannot receive benefits.
- Able bodied adults without dependents (ABAWD) are required to work or participate in a work program for at least 20 hours per week in order to receive SNAP benefits for more than 3 months in a three year period.

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance

Program (SNAP), formerly known as food stamps, provides assistance for low-wage Missourians to purchase food. SNAP benefits cannot be withdrawn as cash or used to purchase alcohol, tobacco, prepared foods, or non-food items such as medicine or paper products.

In FY2017:

SNAP served 351,513 households & 758,918 Missourians.² Average monthly benefit was \$264.62 per household and \$122.57 per person.
